
Spotlight on Box and Slack

Box for Slack also delivers granular admin controls to ensure that the right people have the right access to content and information in the app.

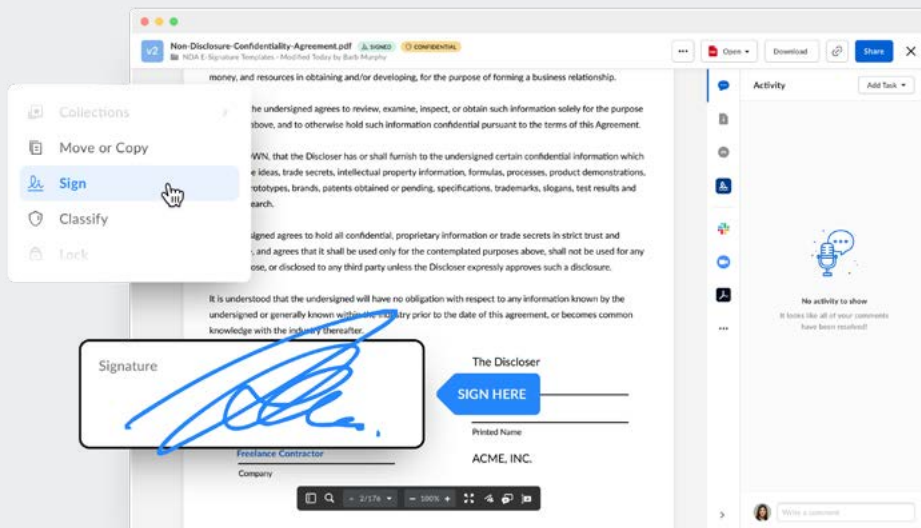

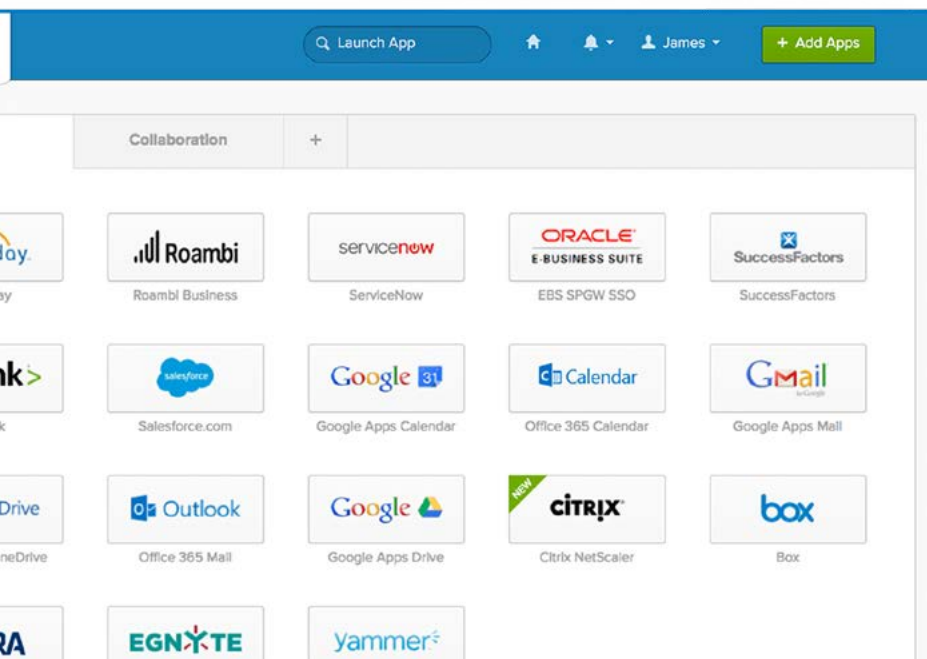


Security across your apps for visibility, protection, and control
