
#### SMART APARTMENT TECHNOLOGY OPTIONS

- Smart sensors: Older adults can connect compatible appliances, lights, speakers, locks, cameras, thermostats – allowing for automatic water shutoff or remote monitoring and thermostats to automate their living spaces.
- **Smart thermostats:** Al allows older adults to remotely control their home's temperature via mobile or other IoT devices.
- **Smart detectors:** Keep older adults safe with voice–enabled CO<sub>2</sub> and smoke detection technology.
- Smart speakers: Using voice assistant technology, they're personalized to meet the needs of each user and offer handsfree activation of smart home connected devices and tools.
- Smart lighting: Remote control lighting offers new options for older adults, which can help with fall prevention and support them with memory, mobility, visual impairment and other needs.
- Smart hub: Equipped with a simple custom-built tablet interface, this runs on an open platform that allows even nonverbal users to stay connected to family, friends and caregivers.

## **CHALLENGE**

A customer was looking for ways to be innovative and gain a competitive edge in the senior living space by creating "smart homes" for their new location in Arizona. They didn't know where to start from a technology standpoint and needed a partner to help guide not only their own IT department but their leadership team, business development team, and marketing and communications teams.

### **SOLUTION**

CDW helped the customer implement technology primarily from Google, including Nest Hub Max, Nest Video Doorbell, Nest Thermostat, Nest Temperature Sensor, Home Hub, and WiFi 3-pack. CDW also found a company, Insteon, for smart dimmer switches that integrated well with Google's technology.

#### RESULT

The initial pilot was a success and led to an expanded rollout for 13 additional villas. The customer was one of the first to implement smart homes in their communities, and they plan to implement these smart homes within their new senior living high-rise community in Virginia in 2023, as well as in their communities in Illinois.
